P2N PARKES TO NARROMINE

Level Crossing upgrades and temporary closures – Hargreaves Road, Narromine

Inland Rail is a once-in-a-generation project connecting regional Australia to domestic and international markets. Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC) has engaged INLink (a joint venture between BMD Constructions and Fulton Hogan) to upgrade and build the first section of the Inland Rail, from Parkes to Narromine.

Temporary road closures

As part of the work we are upgrading level crossings and laying new rail between Parkes and Narromine. While we do this, we need to temporarily close public roads.

Hargreaves Road closure will be extended to install the new rail, eliminating the need for a second closure in the future. Hargreaves Road will now remain closed until end of January 2020.

Timing and location:

Hargreaves Road, Narromine

- Off the Peak Hill Railway Road, Narromine
- Extended to end of January 2020
- Road detour: Local access only will be provided for landowners on Hargreaves Road. Hargreaves Road is not a through road

What we will be doing


- Removing existing rail and sleepers
- Install drainage and culverts
- Build road formations
- Construct level crossing (concrete treatment)
- Install new gravel (ballast)
- Laying new rail and sleepers
- Tamping (adjusting) rail into place
- Installing fences and permanent signage

What to expect

- Access to private properties will be maintained
- During the work there will be heavy vehicles travelling to and from the work sites

- Once rail has been installed in each section, the rail will be 'live' and construction trains will be intermittently passing across the level crossing. For your continued safety, please ensure you obey all signage at level crossings.

Work hours

Our standard working hours are between: 7:00 am to 6:00 pm Monday to Friday 8:00 am to 1:00 pm Saturday

If work is required outside these hours, impacted residents will be notified in advance.
