

## Chair's summary

The fifteenth meeting of the Scenic Rim and Ipswich Community Consultative Committee (CCC) was held in Peak Crossing on Thursday, 25 November 2021.

This chair summary provides an overview of the committee meeting regarding the ARTC Inland Rail Calvert to Kagaru (C2K) Project. This summary is a precursor to the committee meeting minutes, which will be published on the Inland Rail website following preparation and endorsement by the committee Chair.

The meeting was chaired by Ms Kathy Baburin and attended by ten representatives appointed as members of the committee. Two apologies were received by committee members. A total of ten observers attended the meeting.

The purpose of the meeting was to share ARTC Inland Rail's level crossing assessment methodology and discuss engagement on the next round of the draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). An update was provided on how ARTC Inland Rail are supporting the Public Health Network to promote mental health services in the community.
