## What you can expect to see in 2025



Inland Rail Team mobilisation – our team will be on site and in towns, from site inspections to door knocks and community events



Contractor (Martinus) mobilisation and construction – Martinus will be on sites along the alignment completing early enabling works and consulting with the community. In the second half of 2025 you can expect to see the commencement of major construction across many sites.



You may also see an increased presence from John Holland, the delivery contractor for the Illabo to Stockinbingal (I2S) section of the project



# Frequently Asked Questions

## What changes are happening at Edmondson St?

- As part of the A2I project, Edmondson Street bridge is being replaced to allow for the double stacked trains to pass underneath
- The new bridge will be built 2.8m higher than the existing bridge
- Pedestrian access will be separated from the road on both sides with fenced footpaths
- Disability access will be added to the east (station) side of the bridge





### **Frequently Asked Questions Continued**

### What mitigating measures will be in place for noise?



During the construction phase of the project, noise will be the responsibility of our delivery contractor (Martinus)



Once complete, operational noise and vibration is the responsibility of Inland Rail

- Assessments for properties impacted by operational noise and vibration will commence in late 2025
- Mitigations may include, locomotive treatments, noise walls or at-property treatments. If noise walls are required, the development will include community consultation





### **A2I Project Update**


- The A2I/S2P Construction Contractor, Martinus, is working through Secondary Environmental Approvals and Detailed Design
- The NSW State Design Review Panel (SDRP) is ongoing
- The 5th SDRP session was held on 12/12/24;
   Inland Rail are continuing to work with SDRP as the project completes design development
- The detailed design phase is progressing with 20 design and 13 signalling packages across the A2I alignment
- Enabling works near Edmondson Street Bridge is to commence in Q1 2025, includes electricity pole relocations and gas relocations
- Major construction to begin in Q3 2025














1 Control of noise and vibration at source

Specific measures incorporated in the design of the rail infrastructure to control noise and vibration emissions 2 Control the pathway for noise to reach the receptors

Includes options such as rail noise barriers and utilising the civil earthworks to screen noise emissions 3 Control of noise impacts at the receptors

Includes architectural treatment for noise affected properties and upgrading existing property fencing





# Operational Noise and Vibration - Consultation

- Operational noise mitigation measures are under development
- Community consultation is planned to commence in mid-2025

#### **Consultation includes:**

- 1. Identification of sensitive land uses
- 2. Stakeholder preferences (by location)
- 3. Type and timing of implementation





### **Operational Noise Monitoring**

- Noise and vibration monitoring is carried out to refine the operational noise model
- Monitoring has been carried out adjacent to the Wagga Viaduct
- Monitoring at various distances from the track across Wagga and Junee
- Data from locomotive noise outputs at various speeds has been incorporated into the noise model







### Wagga Traffic Management

- Construction Traffic Management Plans have been produced and are under review
- A specific Wagga Precinct Plan has been produced for Stage A works and is currently under review
- Current works involve utility investigations and relocations
- Short-term traffic management will be implemented to support these works

# **Engagement Update**

- Continuing our work with Councils and key stakeholders along the A2I alignment through regular engagement
- Monthly monitoring meetings with Councils and our delivery partner, Martinus
- Door knocking activities around Edmondson St precinct advising of early enabling and site establishment works commencing in Wagga from January 2025
- Works notifications distributed through door knocking, letter box drops, social media posts, email and newspaper advertisements
- Joint meetings held with Martinus and directly impacted stakeholders around the Edmondson Street bridge area including schools and community organisations
- Qtr. 1 Councillor briefings occurring throughout Feb 2025

#### Site Establishment Work Wagga Wagga January 2025



Martinus has been engaged to undertake construction on the Inland Rail project in New South Wales.

Martinus will undertake work to establish a temporary site compound adjacent to Railway Street and within the rail corridor at Wagga Wagga. Site establishment work will commence from 6 January 2025, with construction works to follow.

The work will occur during normal construction hours of 7am to 6pm Monday to Saturday.

In the event that work is required outside these construction hours, impacted neighbours will be notified in advance.

We will also keep you updated by sending regular construction updates and notifications advising of key work dates.

#### Work being done

- Clearing and grubbing
- Surveying and environmental sampling
- Removing topsoil
- Earthworks
- Installing temporary site sheds and lunch facilities
- Installing temporary fencing and environmental controls
- Installing a car park and facilities for our workers
- Investigating utilities involving non-destructive digging (NDD) along Edmondson, Erin, Macleay and Railway Street.

#### What can I expect?

- Heavy vehicle movements, earth-moving activities and delivery of temporary site offices, machinery, equipment, and other materials
- Traffic management will be in place to facilitate vehicle and pedestrian movement. To ensure the safety of drivers and workers, please observe all traffic management instructions and signage
- · Reduced speed limits of 40km/h near works
- Martinus branded vehicles and employees
- Nearby residents may hear some noise during this time and can expect some additional construction workers and vehicles in the area.

#### Machinery used

Equipment used for work includes but is not limited to hand tools, saw cutter, loaders, vibrating rollers, excavators, water carts, survey equipment, power washer, skid steer, heavy and light vehicles.

#### How we're managing impacts

- Works programmed to best minimise noise impacts
- · Traffic controls will be in place, where required
- Water carts will be on-site to wet down areas to assist in managing dust
- Use of non-tonal reversing alarms on all equipment and turning off equipment when not in use
- Instructing workers to keep noise to a minimum and being respectful of our neighbours
- Works will be monitored to ensure compliance with Project Approval Conditions.

## **Community Grants – Round 23**

- Voices of Women Incorporated Women of the Riverina stories is to be perform in a live show at the Wagga Wagga Art Gallery December 2024 and release those stories on the Voices of Women Apple podcast including short film in Dec-March 2025. Three years talking to women in workshops to create Women of the Riverina, now ready to share 14 short stories from the Riverina that celebrate the region's women across cultures and generations.
- <u>Carevan Wagga -</u> Improve warehouse security by installing three security cameras and a
  hard drive to monitor for the wellbeing of volunteers who cook in excess of 2000 meals
  each month.
- Rural Outreach Counselling (ROC) Host a free community outdoor movie event in Wagga, use the event as a platform to distribute information about mental health resources and services provided by ROC.
