



JUNEE: Free Community Shuttle Service Information and FAQs

Kemp Street bridge will be temporarily closed from Friday, 5 September 2025, for approximately 18 months while we build a new higher bridge as part of the Albury to Illabo section of Inland Rail.

We know how important this bridge is to the Junee community, so we've worked closely with Junee Shire Council, Transport for NSW and local residents to make sure everyone can still get where they need to go. To help reduce disruption during the closure, a free east-west community shuttle will operate daily. This service is designed to support all residents including school-aged children, elderly people, and those with mobility needs to stay connected while the bridge is closed.

Timetable

Weekdays

- Morning peak: every 30 minutes, 7:00am 10:00am
- Off-peak: hourly, 10:00am 3:00pm
- Afternoon peak: every 30 minutes, 3:00pm 6:00pm

Saturday

- 7:00am 12:00pm: every 30 minutes
- 12:00pm 6:00pm: hourly

Sunday

- 8:00am 12:00pm: every 30 minutes
- 12:00pm 6:00pm: hourly

Where to catch the community shuttle?

This will be a "hail and ride" service with stops shown on the route map. Temporary signs will be placed at each stop so you know exactly where to wait.

How to catch the community shuttle?

It's simple — anyone can use the shuttle, free of charge. Just head to one of the marked stops and signal (flag down) the driver as the shuttle approaches.

Is the shuttle accessible for people with mobility needs?

Yes. The shuttle is wheelchair-accessible and suitable for prams, walking frames, and other mobility aids.

Can school students use the community shuttle?

Yes. In addition to their usual school buses, a dedicated student shuttle will operate at peak school travel times.

How long does the trip take?

A full circuit of the shuttle route takes around 15–20 minutes, depending on traffic and passenger numbers.

What if the shuttle is full?

If the shuttle reaches capacity, the driver may ask some passengers to wait for the next service. The short turnaround time means you won't be waiting long.

Can I bring shopping bags, prams, or small items with me?

Yes. The shuttle can accommodate prams, shopping bags, and personal items, but please keep luggage and bulky items to a minimum so space is available for everyone.

Are pets allowed on the shuttle?

Only registered assistance animals are permitted on board.

Will the shuttle run on public holidays?

Yes. The shuttle will operate on public holidays to the same weekend timetable unless otherwise advertised.

What if I miss the shuttle?

Simply wait for the next service. Timetables are frequent enough that another shuttle will be along soon.

More information on staying connected

The community shuttle is just one of the transport options available to help residents during the closure. Other measures include:

- School bus access eligible students will continue to have access to existing school bus services, plus a dedicated student shuttle during peak times.
- Taxi vouchers eligible residents will be able to request free taxi vouchers for essential trips outside shuttle operating hours.
