1.Welcome & Introductions	The Chair opened the meeting with an Acknowledgement of Country and welcomed all to the meeting.

5.Proponent's Reports	Mr Malcom Clark (Project Director – A2I/S2P) Program and Project Update		
	Mr Clark provided an update on the adjacent projects:		
	Illabo to Stockinbingal (I2S)		
	Detailed design and consultation are ongoing. Establishment of the Workers Accommodation has commenced at Stockinbingal. Low impact works, Geotech and potholing, fencing and winter bird surveys are ongoing.		
	Stockinbingal to Parkes (S2P)		
	Major construction is nearing completion and earthworks are underway at Daroobalgie and Wyndham to finalise landscaping. Overhead wire relocations are due to start later this year, and the heritage interpretation signage is to be installed at the Forbes station. All works are scheduled to be completed by mid-2025.

	A2I Program Update (A2I)	
	Mr Clark provided an overview of the A2I program detailing the works to be undertaken as part of the program and the timeframes for each activity with all works scheduled to be completed by Q2 2027 (see presentation). Main activity will commence later in 2025.	
	Specific reference was made to the delay in the Edmondson Street bridge closure as the traffic mitigation plan is still progressing together with consultation with key stakeholders. Currently the main work is being concentrated between Junee and Illabo.	
	A2I is moving from Construction Stage A to Stage B. Enabling works are continuing around Wagga Wagga. Site compound establishment is to occur near the Pearson Street works as well as Bomen and Junee. Works are occurring from Junee to Illabo with major construction to begin in Q3 2025. Work continues with key stakeholders to progress and seek approval for traffic Management plans and to confirm the new bussing routes for Wagga Wagga. Out of hours works and night closure of Edmondson St bridge in wagga Wagga expect to be completed in July.	
	Design Progress shows clearance site are at 98%, Junee to Illabo is 100%, Albury is 94%, Wagga sites are 91% and Junee sites are 91%. Construction Progress is concentrated in the Junee to Illabo section.	
	Wagga Traffic Management Plan	
	The project is currently in a collaborative review with Wagga Wagga City Council and Transport for NSW, once completed the plan will be submitted to DPHI for approval. This is currently anticipated late 2025 and not in advance of the September track shutdown initially targeted. The review is focussing on mitigation strategies to address identified problematic locations and modelling scenarios of proposed detours and mitigations.

	Under current approvals, work will continue on and around Edmondson St bridge during the September track possession and will remain open to traffic.	
	Engagement with the Wagga Wagga community will occur to inform them when the pre-construction traffic trail will start, when the bridge will close and what temporary traffic mitigation measures will be during these periods.	
	Bus routes are under discussion with local bus operators to finalise alternate bus routes for when the bridge is closed.

	 Mobilise Junee Kemp St compound Commence construction of the Junee train Driver Changeover Platforms Establishment of the Pearson St site compound in Wagga September possession Construct temporary footbridge access at Cassidy & Wagga Station Continuation of track works between Junee and Illabo, and Commence works in Albury precinct at the Albury Station and Billy Hughes Bridge 	
	September Possession	
	Wagga Wagga – under current approvals continuing the work on and around Edmondson St bridge and the bridge will remain open to traffic. The Edmondson St bridge is now de-linked from the other Wagga works.	
	Junee – Kemp St bridge closure from end of August with remove occurring during the September possession.	
	The Rock – minor signalling work will occur.	
	Ms Rachael Labruyere (Environment Manager A2P) - Planning and Environment Update	
	Ms Labruyere provided an overview of activities including low impact works, development of the Stage A Environmental Management Plan (EMP), development of mitigation measures and biodiversity offsetting. Currently review Stage B Draft Environmental Management Plans prior to them being submitted to DPHI for approval.	
	Updates are currently occurring around a proposed modification to the Kemp Street Bridge in June and planned that all Stage B EMPs will be approved in time for the September possession which will then move to the State B construction phase.	
	Operational Air Quality Monitoring	
	The Project conditions of approval require air quality monitoring to help plan and ensure environmental standards are met. This will involve gathering data to better understand local air quality

	during existing train operations particularly those adjacent to idling locations. The monitoring will run for approximately 12 months. Currently developing the background air quality monitoring plan to identify monitoring locations and monitoring will likely commence in 2026.	
	Climate Change Risk Assessment	
	As part of the sustainability program the Inland Rail Project is undertaking a Climate Change Risk Assessment. Two climate models were used to inform the assessment, and 24 risks were identified across two-time horizons: near term 2030 (2020-2040) and long term 2090 (2080-2100). Of the 24 risks identified, 19 are categorised as direct risks, three as indirect risks and two as both indirect and direct. The risk rating and 2090 risks were tabled with proposed key adaptions together with the initial risk rating and the residual risk rating (see presentation). The same assessment is also being conducted for I2S. Ms Kate Hardy (Stakeholder Engagement Lead A2I) -	
	Community Update.	
	The engagement team continue to work with Councils and key stakeholders along the A2I alignment through regular engagement. Monthly monitoring meetings continue to occur with Martinus and Councils.	
	Monthly meetings with key stakeholders, Multicultural Council, Wagga Catholic Diocese, Kildare Catholic College, Erin Earth, South Wagga Public School.	
	STEM workshops have been conducted at Yerong Creek Public School, Holy Trinity Primary School, The Bidgee School, The Rock Central School, Uranquinity Public School, Henschke Catholic Primary School, Ashmont Public School, South Wagga Public School and Red Hill Public School.	
	Community Grants have been made to Albury Preschool Kindergarten, Henty Community Club, Mawang Gaway Elders Group Wagga NAIDOC Ball, NSW Basketball NAIDOC Gala Day, Wagga Wagga Rail Heritage Association, Cycling Without Age Wagga Chapter, Eastern Riverina Landcare and St Joseph's

	Primary in Junee. The next Grants program is now open, and members were asked to promote this among their communities.		
	Wagga visualisations were undertaken May 12-14 reaching out to 220 residents, 10 stakeholder meetings and 2 community information sessions with approximately 180 interactions.		
	Community information sessions were held at the Wagga Sturt Mall, May 16, South Wagga Public School, May 22, The Rock and Uranquinity, May 23, Culcairn, May 27, Yerong Creek, May 28, Henty and Albury, May 29 and Wagga Marketplace, June 4.		
	Q3 activities will see continuation of Councillor briefings, as well as planning for the Henty Field days and other local shows along the alignment. Sponsorships have been provided to the Junee and Wagga Shows. Wagga, Try a Trade Day attendance on August 21 and Junee visualisation engagement is planned for mid August.

	Ms Hardy provided an overview of the community benefits flowing from the A2I and S2P projects July 2023 – April 2025. (see presentation).		
	Ms Hardy tabled a report of the Inland Rail Skills Academy for the Wagga Wagga LGA. It will be regularly updated (see presentation). Other LGA reports will be undertaken in the future.		
6.General Business	Mr David Carter questioned whether the Waterworks Rd crossing was under review?		
	MC advised that it would only be a design review on the Waterworks Rd side of the crossing. No change is planned for the highway side except for formalisation of access onto the highway. No changes to the highway itself.

	Cr Richard Foley sought clarification on how the traffic light sequencing will work? MC explained how the adaptive cameras across the Sturt Highway would work. Noting that they will be monitored and controlled by TfNSW and that a TfNSW representative will be assigned during the trial closure and as part of the operational group throughout the full closure period.
	Cr Richard Foley asked if the trial closure of the bridge would be during school term? MC advised the trial is currently being targeted for late term 4 and if the trial is successful this will allow a direct move to have the noisy work over holiday period to mitigate the impact on the schools. Two additional possessions have also been negotiated, 1 in December and another one in week 2 of term 1, 2026.
	Mr David Carter asked if the driver changeover platform in Junee was being moved back into town. MC noted that it was not and that it was utilising a pre-existing point to the north of town closer to where the Olympic Highway crosses under the rail line.
