

Construction Update

Billy Hughes Bridge

April 2026 to June 2027



Our contractor Martinus is continuing construction works at the Billy Hughes bridge site.

Works will continue from **April 2026 to June 2027**, during our revised construction hours of **7am to 6pm, Monday to Sunday** (including public holidays), subject to weather and ground conditions.

If works are required outside the revised construction hours above, advance notice will be provided to our neighbours.

Possession work

Martinus will also carry out works at this site during extended periods of track possession.

These works will be ongoing, including night shifts during this period. The affected neighbours will be notified in advance of these works.

Track possessions are critical to the project, as no trains will run during this period. This helps us complete our work faster and minimise disruption to the community.

Work being done

- Ground drilling for concrete piling
- Drainage installation
- Signalling and track-related works
- Earthworks and excavations
- Constructing a retaining wall and a protection barrier
- Establishing temporary site compound and laydown areas
- Grubbing and vegetation removal, where required
- Operation of the temporary site compound
- Environmental monitoring and ground surveys
- Construction material and equipment deliveries.

What can I expect?

- Heavy vehicles operating at this work site
- Reduced speed limit of 40km/h near works, where required
- Nearby residents may experience some noise and vibration
- On-site traffic management, where required. Please follow all instructions and signage

Machinery used


Equipment includes but is not limited to hand tools, mobile crane, hydraulic hammer, concrete pump, generators, semi-trucks, lightning towers, loaders, vibrating rollers, tamper, elevated work platform (EWP), hi-rail equipment, saw cutter, excavators, water carts, survey equipment, piling rig, skid steer, power washer, heavy and light vehicles.

How we're managing impacts

- Water carts on-site to dampen the ground and help manage dust
- Non-tonal reversing alarms will be used on all equipment, and equipment will be switched off when not in use
- Ongoing monitoring of noise and vibration and communication with key stakeholders and neighbours
- Traffic controls, where required, to ensure vehicle and pedestrian safety
- Workers will be instructed to keep noise to a minimum and show respect to our neighbours
- The works will be monitored to ensure compliance with Project Approval Conditions and adherence to the requirements as outlined in the Environmental Protection Licence (EPL 21984).

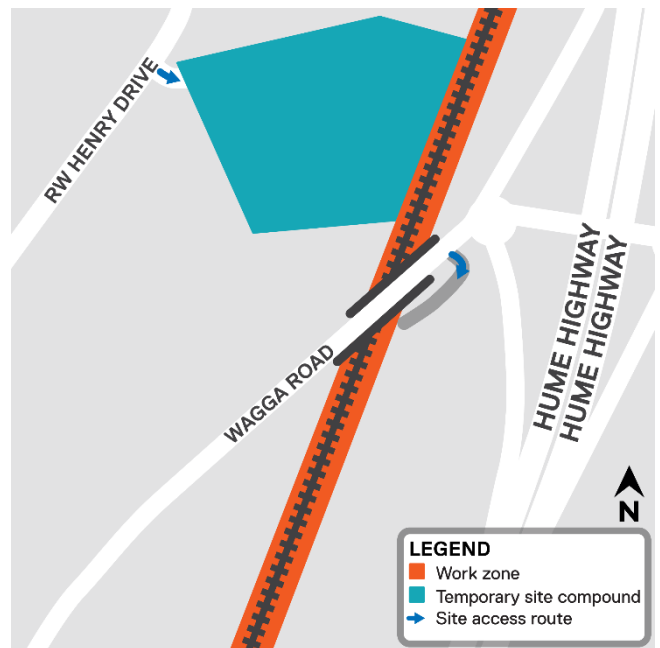
