

Cassidy footbridge highly intensive works

Turvey Park March 2026

Martinus, our construction contractor, will continue piling works for the new Cassidy Footbridge at Cassidy Parade, Wagga Wagga.

Piling is an important part of building a safe and long-lasting bridge. It involves installing deep foundations using large machinery, including piling rigs and cranes.

Works being done

To support the piling activities, crews will build a piling pad on Cassidy Parade. This creates a stable platform for the crane and piling rig.

To prepare the ground, a vibration roller will be used to compact the area.

During these works, a pedestrian diversion will be in place on Cassidy Parade to keep the community safely away from the active work zone.

On the Brookong Avenue side of the bridge, workers will complete pile break backs, which involve breaking away the top portion of the pile to connect it properly to the structure.

When will works occur

Works will commence from Tuesday 10 March. Highly intensive works can be performed between the hours of

- 8:00 am to 6:00 pm Monday to Friday
- 8:00 am to 1:00 pm Saturday

What can I expect?

These works are considered highly intensive works, involving loud, repetitive noise and noticeable ground vibration.

Machinery used

Vibration roller, excavators, jack hammers, piling rig and mobile crawler crane, light vehicles, hand tools.

How we're managing impacts

- Carry out noise and vibration monitoring on

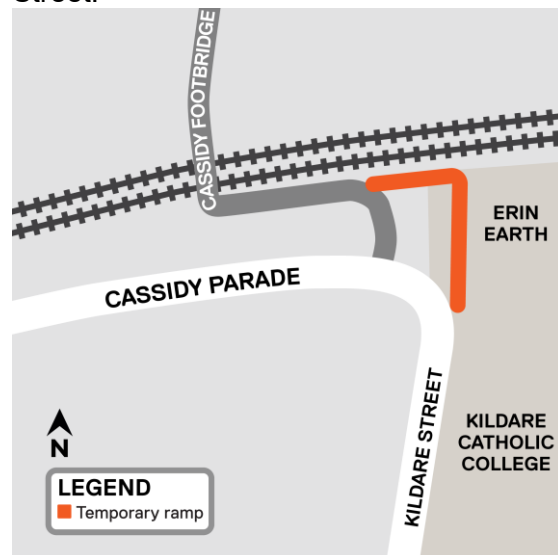
site.

- Ensure highly intensive activities do not continue for more than three hours at a time, with at least a one-hour break before they resume.

Pedestrian Detour

Cassidy footbridge will remain open during these works. For your safety, a pedestrian detour will be in place around the piling site on Cassidy Parade.

Pedestrians will be redirected to exit the Cassidy Footbridge near Erin Earth and continue via Kildare Street.
