

Heavy vehicle delivery out of hours

Edmondson Bridge Wagga Wagga

12- 13 May 2026

Martinus will be moving essential oversized and over mass piling equipment required for construction at Edmondson Street bridge.

Piling is an important step in building strong foundations to support the new bridge, requiring the use of large and over-sized rigs and cranes.

These machines cannot be transported on standard trucks, so they require special oversized vehicles.

Works being done

Heavy vehicles will deliver essential piling machinery with a pilot vehicle under traffic control to Edmondson Street cross of Erin Street (Kildare College side)

When will works occur

- Tuesday 12 May between **8pm-12am**
- Wednesday 13 May between **8pm - 12am**

Traffic control will temporarily close the intersection of Sturt Highway / Best Street / Edmondson Street to allow the heavy vehicle movement from site.

Machinery used

Pilot vehicle, flatbed semi-trailer, piling rig and mobile crawler crane, light vehicles and lighting towers.

What can I expect

- Pilot vehicle and traffic control to safety move machinery
- Traffic control to control the intersection of Best / Edmondson and Sturt Highway during access to and from site
- Some noise while vehicles are unloaded, noise monitoring on site will be conducted to ensure compliance with environmental licence requirements.

- Increased lighting during these times, we will direct lights away from homes.
