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1. KEY FINDINGS FOR THE REPORTING PERIOD

Critical State Significant Infrastructure (CSSI) 9406 Condition of Approval (CoA) A26(j) requires that the Environmental Representative (ER) must *'prepare and submit to the Planning Secretary and other relevant regulatory agencies, for information and make publicly available, an Environmental Representative Monthly Report providing the information set out in the Environmental Representative Protocol under the heading "Environmental Representative Monthly Reports". The Environmental Representative Monthly Report must be submitted within seven (7) days following the end of each month for the duration of the ER's engagement for the CSSI.'*

This Environmental Representative (ER) Monthly Report has been prepared in accordance with CoA A26(j), covering the period from 1 to 30 June 2026 (the reporting period).

Works undertaken during the reporting period include bulk earthworks, crushing and screening, minor clearing and grubbing, mulching of timber for reuse, piling pad construction, piling works, fencing, utility relocation, cadastral surveys, installation of culverts and stock crossings, installation and maintenance of erosion and sediment controls, dewatering, CSR works Illabo junction and test blast cut 19.

No incidents causing or threatening to cause material harm were reported during the reporting period. No non-compliances were reported during the reporting period.

Consultation with potentially affected stakeholders continued during the reporting period in the form of meetings, emails, telephone calls, SMS's, notifications, a public information session and website updates. Consultation with other stakeholders such as local businesses, community groups, emergency services, Council and schools, also occurred during the reporting period.

Four complaints were received during the reporting period related to worker / driver behaviour. One complaint, related to project traffic safety near Dudauman Lane school bus stop, remained open at the time of completing this report. In this regard, the Principal Contractor John Holland Group (JHG) met with the complainant on site to discuss the safety concern and advised that it is investigating safety measures in this area. The other three complaints were closed following investigation and worker / driver communication.

No documents were endorsed or approved by the ER during June 2026.

Two inspections were conducted by the ER during the reporting period - 3 and 17 June 2026. Actions identified in the inspection reports have been progressively closed out with evidence provided by the contractor after the inspections. At the time of completing this report close-out of identified actions is continuing.

The ER will continue to report on the progress of the Project each month.

2. BACKGROUND

Inland Rail is a proposed 1,600km freight rail line, comprising 12 sections, which will connect Melbourne and Brisbane via regional Victoria, New South Wales and Queensland. Inland Rail Pty

Ltd (IRPL), a subsidiary of Australian Rail Track Corporation (ARTC), is building Inland Rail on behalf of the Australian Government. As each section of Inland Rail is completed, it will be operated and managed by ARTC.

ARTC obtained approval from the NSW Minister for Planning and Public Spaces for the Inland Rail's Illabo to Stockinbingal (I2S) section (Critical State Significant Infrastructure (CSSI-9406)) on the 4 September 2024 under Section 5.19 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (the EP&A Act) (the Project) subject to Conditions of Approval (CoA).

The I2S Project (the Project) involves the construction and operation of approximately 39 Kilometres of new single-track standard gauge railway to accommodate trains with a maximum length of 1,800m. Key features involve:

- connection to other rail lines, including Stockinbingal to Parkes line, Lake Cargelligo line, and Main Southern Railway
 - one crossing loop and maintenance siding
 - level crossings and stock crossings
 - bridges over rivers and other watercourses, floodplains and roads
 - upgrade of around 3.5km of existing track for the tie-in works to the existing Main South Line at Illabo
- new track to maintain Lake Cargelligo line connection either side of the proposal
- realignment and road-over rail bridge for a section of the Burley Griffin Way at Stockinbingal
 - realignment of Ironbong Road to allow for safe sight lines at the new active level crossing
 - ancillary infrastructure to support the proposal, inclusive of signalling and communications; drainage, drainage control areas, signage and fencing, and services and utilities; and
 - construction infrastructure, including ancillary facilities, and a temporary workforce accommodation facility.

In accordance with CoA A22 – A25, IRPL sought approval to engage WolfPeak's Ricardo Prieto-Curiel, Derek Low and Tim Elder as the Project's primary and alternate ERs respectively. This approval was granted by the Planning Secretary's nominee of the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI) on 11 September 2024 and 7 February 2025.

John Holland (JHG) have been engaged as the Principal Contractor to design and construct the Project. The Project is currently in the 'Detailed design and early works (including low impact work) stage.

CoA A26(j) requires that for the duration of the works or as otherwise approved by the Planning Secretary, the ER must *'prepare and submit to the Planning Secretary and other relevant regulatory agencies, for information and make publicly available, an Environmental Representative Monthly Report providing the information set out in the Environmental Representative Protocol under the heading "Environmental Representative Monthly Reports". The Environmental*

Representative Monthly Report must be submitted within seven (7) days following the end of each month for the duration of the ER's engagement for the CSSI.'

This ER Monthly Report has been prepared in accordance with CoA A26(j), covering the period from the 1 to 30 June 2026 (the reporting period).

3. PROJECT ACTIVITIES

3.1 Construction works

3.1.1 Works undertaken during the reporting period

Construction activities continued throughout June 2026. The following activities were completed or underway during the reporting period:

- Corridor boundary fence line construction and rectification
- Crushing and screening
- Minor clear and grub works Section 1 under ecologist supervision
- Mulching of felled timber for re-use
- Continuation of piling pad construction (Billabong Creek)
- Piling works Powderhorn Creek, Ulandra Creek Isobel Tributary
- CSR works Illabo Junction (Section 1)
- Utility relocations including water cutover Burley Griffin Way
- Bulk earthworks, including:
 - Topsoil stripping
 - Foundation preparation
 - Open drain excavation
 - Cut excavation and fill installation
- Cadastral survey
- Installation of culverts and stock crossings
- Dewatering works following approximately 25ml rain
- Test blast cut 19

3.1.2 Upcoming works

The following works are planned for July 2026:

- Blasting works
- Continuation of bridge piling works

- Continuation of bulk earthworks
- Installation of culverts and stock crossings
- Installation of envelope pipes
- Installation and maintenance of ERSED controls
- Dewatering works following >50mm rain
- Completion of utilities relocation works
- Foundation treatments

Proposed Out of Hours Works (OOHW) planned for July 2026 include (to be carried out under the Environment Protection Licence (EPL):

- Sunday works (not affecting the same receiver every second Sunday) for bulk earthworks, culverts, drainage, utilities, and CSR works at Illabo Junction
- Sunday works under negotiated agreements (Environment Protection Licence)
- Night and evening works (Monday-Saturday) for water carts, refuelling trucks, deliveries, and utilities cutover works.
- Evening works for piling including late concrete finishing works if required

3.2 Minor construction ancillary facilities

Nothing to report for June 2026.

3.3 Changes to the Project

3.3.1 Construction Staging

JHG are constructing the Project in two Stages:

Stage 1: Limited scope of works completed during the September 2025 rail possession to conduct maintenance on the existing Main South Line (MSL). This will support the delivery of the Project and to ensure uninterrupted operations of the MSL throughout the construction period.

Stage 2: All other construction activities

A Staging Report was prepared in accordance with CoA A11 and A12 to reflect this staging approach. The ER reviewed and endorsed the Staging Report (Rev 0) on 29 August 2025. Stage 2 construction continued during the reporting period.

3.3.2 Consistency Assessments

A Consistency Assessment (CA) was determined by Inland Rail during the reporting period as follows:

- Consistency Assessment (Minor) - Corridor Fencing | Rev 0 | Document Number: 6-0019-220-EEC-00-RP-0008 | Date: 16 June 2026

3.4 Community consultation and complaints received

3.4.1 Consultation

Consultation with potentially affected stakeholders continued during the reporting period in the form of meetings, emails, telephone calls, SMS's, notifications, a public information session and website updates. Consultation primarily related to upcoming proposed activities and work updates including blasting notifications, access and traffic management, maintenance, livestock movements and addressing complaints and inquiries. A total of 160 monthly community notifications were delivered in Stockinbingal, 100 in Illabo and 157 were emailed to the community distribution list. A public information session was held at Dirnaseer Memorial Hall on the 30 June 2026 to inform about the project and upcoming works, and meet IRPL and JHG project team members. Work notifications are available in the IRPL project website (<https://inlandrail.com.au/where-we-go/projects/illabo-to-stockinbingal/works-notifications/>).

Consultation with other stakeholders such as local businesses, community groups, emergency services, Council and schools, also occurred during the reporting period.

A summary of consultation undertaken during the month is provided in Appendix A.

3.4.2 Complaints

The complaints register current to 30 June 2026 was supplied to the ER. It includes details of all complaints received and the actions undertaken by JHG to resolve each complaint.

Four complaints were received during the reporting period related to worker / driver behaviour. One complaint, related to project traffic safety near Dudauman Lane school bus stop, remained open at the time of completing this report. In this regard, JHG met with the complainant on site to discuss the safety concern and advised that it is investigating safety measures in this area. The other three complaints were closed following investigation and worker / driver communication.

A copy of the complaints register can be provided by IRPL to DPHI on request, in accordance with CoA B11.

3.5 Incidents, Emergency Works, Non-compliances and Unexpected Finds

3.5.1 Incidents

No incidents causing or threatening to cause material harm were reported to DPHI during the reporting period.

Four minor low severity spills occurred during the reporting period as follows:

- 13/06: During earthworks activities, a scraper's hydraulic line was ruptured, causing about 5 litres of hydraulic fluid to be released onto the disturbed surface in the cut area. The hydraulic line was sealed. Pads and peat were placed on the spill site.
- 20/06: While refuelling a generator at Grogan Road Camp, about 1 litre of fuel was released onto a hardstand surface. Spill controls were promptly implemented.
- 22/06: A scraper experienced a hydraulic oil leak while in motion. The leak was detected promptly, and the plant was shut down within 30 meters of where it started. A grader collected and disposed of the accumulated oil sediment in a designated contaminated waste container. The scraper was repaired immediately.
- 25/06: An excavator had a hydraulic oil spill caused by a leak in one of its hoses; a mechanic was called in to rectify. Spill kit was deployed immediately.

In all instances, and JHG responded rapidly to contain the minor spills. No oil left the site or entered the stormwater system.

3.5.2 Emergency Works

No emergency works were reported during the reporting period.

3.5.3 Non-compliances

No non-compliances reported to DPHI in accordance with CoA A36 during the reporting period.

3.5.4 Unexpected Finds

There were no unexpected finds reported during June 2026.

4. ER ACTIVITIES

4.1 Advice provided to the Proponent on the CoA and other authority conditions

Advice has been provided by the ER to IRPL and JHG since late 2024 through to June 2026. Further details of advice provided during the reporting period is provided in Section 4.2.

4.2 Environmental management plans and programs

4.2.1 Development

CEMP and Sub-plans have been developed from late 2024 and submitted to the ER for approval or endorsement. No documents were required to be endorsed or approved by the ER during the reporting period.

JHG has undertaken the biannual review of management plans and review of these documents by the ER is in progress.

4.2.2 Implementation

Construction activities continued throughout the reporting period generally in accordance with approved Management Plans and CoAs.

4.2.3 Site inspections

Two site inspections were undertaken by the ER during the reporting period – 3 and 17 June 2026. The ER Inspection Reports have been provided to DPHI –refer to these reports for specific details.

Actions identified in the inspection reports have been progressively addressed with evidence provided by the contractor after the inspections. At the time of completing this report, a small number of actions remained open or in progress associated with gate identification, soil erosion and sediment control works and construction access establishment (as documented within the latest ER Inspection Report of 1 July 2026).

ER inspections for next reporting period are scheduled for 1 July (completed), 15 July and 29 July.

4.2.4 Audits

An independent audit under CoAs A28-A33 was undertaken from 22 - 24 April 2026. Audit findings are available within the Independent Audit Report.

4.2.5 Complaint resolution

One complaint remains open at the time of reporting as detailed in Section 3.4.2.

4.2.6 Meetings

Meetings with IRPL and JHG, including the involvement of the ER, have been undertaken as required throughout the reporting period to discuss construction works, Project documentation and general Project issues. In addition, weekly meetings with IRPL, JHG and the ER have continued throughout the reporting period covering Project works, progress on post-approval documentation, compliance, incidents, complaints etc.

Monthly regulatory meetings are undertaken during project delivery with DPHI and are attended by IRPL, JHG and the ER. A meeting between DPHI, IRPL, JHG and the ER was held on 12 June 2026.

4.2.7 Documentation issued

Documentation issued by the ER during the reporting period included:

4.2.8 Communications with the Secretary

There have been no written communications with the Planning Secretary or its representatives during the reporting period, other than issue of the documents listed in section 4.2.7. Informal project discussions have been held with DPHI as required.

5. ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE OF THE PROJECT

5.1 Environmental Performance

Construction works have been ongoing throughout the reporting period. Works undertaken during the reporting period include bulk earthworks, crushing and screening, minor clearing and grubbing, mulching of timber for reuse, piling pad construction, piling works, fencing, utility relocation, cadastral surveys, installation of culverts and stock crossings, installation and maintenance of erosion and sediment controls, dewatering, CSR works Illabo junction and test blast cut 19.

No incidents causing or threatening to cause material harm were reported during the reporting period.

No non-compliances were reported during the reporting period.

Four complaints were received during the reporting period related to worker / driver behaviour. One complaint, related to project traffic safety near Dudauman Lane school bus stop, remained open at the time of completing this report. In this regard, JHG met with the complainant on site to discuss the safety concern and advised that it is investigating safety measures in this area. The other three complaints were closed following investigation and worker / driver communication.

Environmental risk potential is significant with the continuation of ground disturbing works on site. Site inspection actions are progressively being closed out to ensure risk is minimised, and mitigation and control measures continue to be implemented consistent with approval requirements and approved management plans.

5.2 Key learnings

No lessons learned sessions are scheduled at this time. Ongoing increased oversight from the ER in consultation with IRPL will continue during ground disturbance works.
